**MEMORANDUM**

To: All Board Presidents and Superintendents — CSBA Member Boards

Re: 2022 Ballot for CSBA Delegate Assembly — **U.S. Postmark Deadline is Tues. March 15**

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Enclosed is the ballot material for election to CSBA's Delegate Assembly from your region or subregion. It consists of: 1) the ballot (on red paper) listing the candidates, the reverse side of which contains the names of ALL current members of the Delegate Assembly from your region or subregion; and 2) the required candidate biographical sketch form and, if submitted, a resume. In addition, provided is a copy of the ballot on white paper to include with your board agenda. **Only the ballot on red paper is to be completed and returned to CSBA. It must be postmarked by the U.S. Post Office on or before Tuesday, March 15, 2022.**

Your Board may vote for up to the number of seats to be filled in the region or subregion as indicated on the ballot. For example, if there are three seats up for election, the Board may vote for up to three candidates. However, your Board may cast no more than one vote for any one candidate. The ballot also contains a provision for write-in candidates; their name and district must be clearly printed in the space provided.

The ballot must be signed by the Superintendent or Board Clerk and returned in the enclosed envelope; if the envelope is misplaced, you may use your district's stationery. Please write **DELEGATE ELECTION** prominently on the envelope along with the region or subregion number on the bottom left corner of the envelope (this number appears at the top of the ballot). If there is a tie vote, a run-off election will be held. Results will be published by May 11, 2022.

All re-elected and newly elected Delegates will serve two-year terms beginning April 1, 2022 – March 31, 2024. The next meeting of the Delegate Assembly takes place on Saturday, May 21 and Sunday, May 22, 2022. Why are you interested in becoming a Delegate? Please describe the skills and experiences you would bring to the Delegate Assembly.

I am interested in continuing as a delegate in order to advocate for education. Working with CSBA and the Legislature we can help to increase base funding for student learning. I would also like to continue to advocate for school districts in the North Los Angeles County, which are underrepresented and unresourced, to ensure the needs in the Antelope Valley And Santa Clarita Schools are represented. I also have seen the benefit of working and conversing with other Board Members in Region 22 in sharing best practices and new ideas.

Please describe your activities and involvement on your local board, community, and/or CSBA.

I worked as an educator in the Antelope Valley for 28 years, at Eastside Union School District and Antelope Valley High School District, and retired in 2019. I have been a member of Eastside Union School District Board of Trustees for three and one half years, and I have served as the Board President for the past year. I have been a CSBA delegate for a year now, and have attended several Delegate assemblies, as well as attending several CSBA Annual Education Conferences. I have attended one Legislative Action Day. I served one year as the Eastside School District Representative to the Los Angeles County School Trustee, and I am currently serving as the Corresponding Secretary for the Antelope Valley School Board Association.

What do you see as the biggest challenge facing governing boards and how can CSBA help address it?

There are several big challenges facing governing boards currently, including the COVID-19 pandemic, declining enrollment, and full funding of the base for school boards. The COVID-19 pandemic has created opportunities for increasing technology innovations in teaching but created issues with student and staff health and social emotional/mental health and wellbeing. In addition it has exacerbated declining enrollment issues that districts boards have already been facing. Full and fair funding has been a challenge for many years now, and governing boards are still recovering from the cuts of the Great Recession and while the one time COVID funds are helpful they do not help the base funding that is needed to allow school to do the work of caring for students academic and social emotional needs.

What do you see as the biggest challenge facing governing boards and how can CSBA help address it?

I see several big challenges:

- 1) Maintaining a steady, consistent, and TRULY FULLY FUNDED revenue stream for ALL school districts in California in perpetuity. That includes raising the base revenue to benefit each and every student.
- 2) Keeping funding local. Sometimes, I feel the State legislature can't help but overreach into local affairs in its quest to "improve" the educational experience. Mitigate the strings attached with the extra money.
- 3) Keeping schools open for in-person learning to the max extent possible. Allow local school districts to tailor and implement health protocols with minimum interference from state and county agencies. As an example, broad-brushing county-wide mandates and protocols across the Antelope Valley (AV) and Santa Clarita Valley (SCV) does not optimize the educational experience of young minds. Both valleys are not like the rest of LA County (e.g. population density, climate....).
