► Relationship to the adopted course of study and current curricular goals (BP/AR 6161.1)

1	Material will help build foundational skills
	Reading this novel, which is a collection of interconnected short stories, will help increase reading comprehension, improve fluency, and develop vocabulary. The novel affords opportunity to study narration, point of view, and figurative language. The novel will allow for analysis, critical thinking, and conversation in the classroom.
2	Material is cross-curricular to allow for multiple perspectives and POVs
	This novel is told from many points of view, as every chapter focuses on a different character and his/her story. The characters from each story interact with one another and come together in the last chapter and conclusion.
3	Material is appropriate for level of course and units covered
	Yes, the novel was written for a middle school audience. The reading level is 4.8 which is appropriate for the students in our district. The novel ties into various 8th grade units of study provided within the district pacing calendar and can be used to help answer essential questions such as, "How do people develop their own identity?", "How can we be more inclusive?", and "What marks the passage from childhood to adulthood?"

1	Material includes texts written by diverse authors that represent multiple perspectives and universal themes
	The author is an African American male who writes specifically for young adult audiences. Many of his works have won literature awards, including this novel which is a Carnegie Medal winner, a National Book Award finalist, and a Coretta Scott King Honor Book. Various perspectives are presented in this novel by the wide assortment of characters and many universal themes are addressed, such as family and friendship, illness and loss, and challenges and determination.
2	Material has appreciation and understanding of character and story background
	There are multiple, well-developed characters in the novel. The characters are multi-dimensional and represent so many students in our district. The plot is also well-developed and planned out and leads readers from a clear start to resolution, with many rising actions and climatic moments.
3	Material includes characters from diverse groups that are depicted as heroes, positive role models and not simply marginalized
	The characters in this novel are diverse and portrayed positively, even when they are struggling with various plot challenges. The characters make best decisions and mature throughout the story. They are easy to like and cheer for and our students will relate to them.

	The characters represent various ethnic groups, ages, and abilities. They also represent socio-economic groups that mirror those of our students.

1	Material provides experiences in a variety of mediums and different types of texts
	The novel is told in prose form and is broken into chapters that represent different characters and their stories. However, the author also includes poetry and lists to make the story more interesting and to engage readers.

	This novel is a fictional piece. It is grade level appropriate in its format, vocabulary, usage, etc. It is a nice addition to a curriculum that relies heavily on informative non-fiction.
