Local Climate Survey

Provide a valid measure of student perceptions of school safety and connectedness

The Survey Participants

- 2,591 8th grade students completed the survey, which is 85% of the 8th grade class
- 2,607 10th grade students completed the survey, which is 73% of the 10th grade class

The Survey Results

Access to a Broad Course of Study

For the 2021-22 school year, the data reviewed showed that the vast majority of Hart District students had full access to a broad course of studies as defined by California Education Code 51210 and 51210(a) – (i). There was a reduction in enrollment in AP and Honors courses, but the reduction was not group specific. Additionally, full implementation of Integrated and Designated ELD is district wide. English Learners in high school were enrolled in grade-level appropriate classes and had access to the same content and course work as their peers.
