






Standard Academic Development




Standard: Career / College Development



Results from Freshmen Check-In

- Counselors, administrators, and social worker met with EACH student within targeted groups
- Highlights from individual meetings with students:

- a) 106 Chromebooks given to students who stated they do not have computers at home
- b) Students in crisis identified and referred for more intensive counseling services
- c) Groups of students provided basic school supplies
- d) Common Cents Mentors created social mixers for students who stated they have not yet found a peer group
- e) Counselors visited 9th grade classrooms to reintroduce themselves
- f) 9th grade teachers committed to teaching organizational skills
- g) Club lists given to each 9th grade student who indicated he/she is not currently involved in a school activity
