



# Health Services in the William S. Hart School District 2019

School Nurses/Health Technicians services:


- ▶ 8,582 students with health conditions tracked across the district.
- ▶ Over 800 assessments/screenings completed for IEP's by RN's.
- ▶ Immunization compliance checks for approximately 3500 incoming 7th graders (3,398 for 2019-2020)
- ▶ Extensive physician communication
- ▶ Medication dispensing
- ▶ Customized Health Care Plans
- ▶ Specialized care and training for students with fragile medical needs
- ▶ CPR Training for staff



## UPDATE for 2019: WHAT DO STUDENTS NEED ASSISTANCE WITH?

- ▶ 78 students with Diabetes (+7)
- ▶ 1702 students with Asthma (-40)
- ▶ 459 students with medication administration needs (+3)
- ▶ 279 Health Care Plans
- ▶ 6,343 Other Medical conditions

Our health services staff also provides assistance with students (and staff members) with anxiety, minor injuries, personal health concerns, and more.



## WHAT ELSE DO WE DO?

- ▶ Electronic data monitoring & billing through Practi-Cal
- ▶ Collect physician orders and translate those orders for implementation in the school settings.
- ▶ Develop medical criteria for Health Techs to follow in Practi-Cal.
- ▶ Write and train on Health Care Plans
- ▶ Audit Health Offices
- ▶ Accompany medically fragile students on field trips
- ▶ Update health care conditions in Infinite Campus for current students and incoming 7th graders
- ▶ Provide Vision and Hearing Screening to all JHS students and all students requiring a triennial evaluation (4269)
- ▶ Train One-to-One Aides on specialized procedures.
- ▶ Continual training of staff in Health Services on new State Health directives.
- ▶ Complete accident forms and collect student statements
- ▶ Maintain safety equipment throughout the district (AED devices)
- ▶ Provide AED Training at all sites
- ▶ Maintained CPR training equipment/mannequins
- ▶ Continual updated of the Health Services website.
- ▶ Train new Health Tech substitutes
- ▶ Maintain substitute list
- ▶ Collaborate with surrounding school districts to ensure vaccination compliance for incoming students



## ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- ▶ Updated Health Services Procedure Manual
- ▶ Developed/standardized Health Office Substitute Manual
- ▶ Implemented Field Trip procedures for students with medical needs district-wide
- ▶ Implemented Health Office Audit procedures
- ▶ Audited all Health Offices for compliance
- ▶ Improved Medi-Cal billing
- ▶ CPR Training for Classified/Certificated Staff
- ▶ Added training for Health Techs for: Sudden Cardiac Arrest, HIPPA Overview, Medication Management and new State health directives
- ▶ Updated all medication and specialized procedure forms
- ▶ 100% Immunization Compliant




